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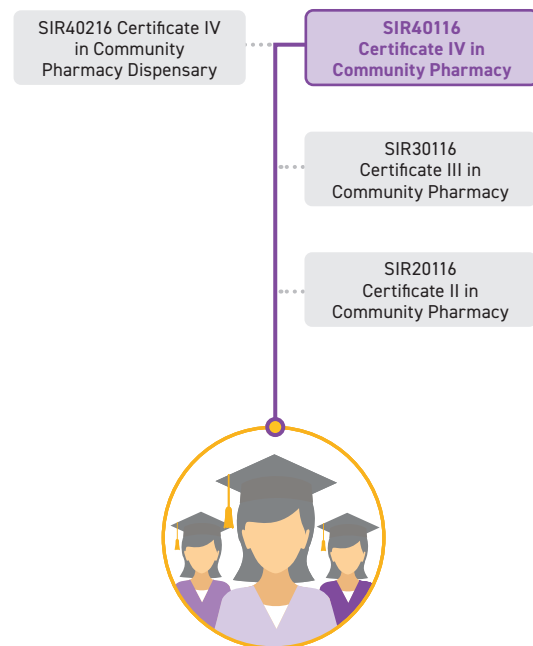

SIR40116 *Certificate IV in Community Pharmacy*

Develops the management skills needed to coordinate pharmacy operations and lead staff, as well as providing specialised, advanced skills across key pharmacy areas.



Who should complete this training?

This qualification will benefit experienced pharmacy assistants who are looking to expand their skills to become a senior pharmacy assistant or front-of-shop manager.

Senior pharmacy assistants are often responsible for the management of particular functions in the pharmacy, the management of a range of health categories or for the supervision of pharmacy staff.

Accredited training can help you develop management skills and provide specialised support in the pharmacy, while granting you formal recognition of your existing skills.

What training do I need?

This qualification provides you with the next step in your career in community Pharmacy. The Certificate IV in Community pharmacy can further build your knowledge of key health conditions and product knowledge or develop new skills in dispensary or supervision.

This qualification is nationally recognised in all states and territories of Australia.

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)?



Available for all qualifications, the RPL process recognises the skills and competencies gained through work experience, prior training and life experience.

Through RPL, competency may be granted for specific units within community pharmacy qualifications, meaning some pharmacy assistants can finish their course earlier than expected.

How long will the course take to complete?

The Certificate IV in Community Pharmacy is a flexible course that can be tailored to meet your learning requirements and career goals.

We will work with you to develop a training plan to meet your needs and the needs of your pharmacy. Most pharmacy assistants complete the course in around 12 months.

What will I study?

To complete the Certificate IV in Community Pharmacy you will need to complete 14 units—3 core units and 11 elective units.

The core units will provide you with foundation skills in leading and managing staff and coordinating key pharmacy functions. The elective units provide you with the opportunity to increase your knowledge of health conditions and advanced product categories.

There are also a range of units to assist you in developing skills in merchandising, quality assurance, marketing and human resource management.

The elective units have been grouped into two streams, Management and Health.

What are the entry requirements?

To undertake a Certificate IV in Community Pharmacy you:

- Need to be employed in a Pharmacy **AND**
- Have achieved the Certificate III in Community Pharmacy **OR**
- Have relevant industry employment experience as a community pharmacy assistant in a job role that has involved the application of skills and knowledge described in core units of competency from SIR30116 Certificate III in Community Pharmacy, and
- Have a statement of attainment in the unit SIRCIND002 Support the supply of Pharmacy Medicines and Pharmacist Only Medicines.

The course has entry requirements which include :

- Having access to a computer or device with internet access
- A degree of digital literacy which allows you to upload documents, recordings and complete your assessments online
- Successfully completing units which are pre-requisites to other units, refer to the following page

Minimum age requirements vary based on state legislation. Please contact us so we can discuss your state's legislation requirements.

When can I start?

The Certificate IV in Community Pharmacy is a flexible course so we can start as soon as you are ready.

How much will this qualification cost?

Eligibility requirements apply to government funded courses which can impact the cost of a course.

Successful completion of a course under government funding may restrict your ability to access further funding.
