Frequently asked questions for patients

Accessing HIV treatment in Queensland

Queensland Health has introduced an HIV medication co-payment waiver for people with HIV who are resident in Queensland, regardless of their Medicare status.

FAQs

What are the eligibility criteria for the HIV co-payment waiver?

To be eligible you must be a Queensland resident who is a patient of a:

- · Queensland public hospital or sexual health clinic, or
- authorised s100 HIV community prescriber in Queensland, or
- an interstate specialist/prescriber if you live in a border area.

You must also be prescribed HIV medication that is listed on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) and have your prescription filled at a Queensland pharmacy.

Medicare-eligible people can go to either a Queensland public hospital or a community pharmacy, while Medicare-ineligible people must have their prescription filled at a public hospital pharmacy.

Does the HIV co-payment waiver apply to people accessing Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)?

No. The co-payment waiver is only for HIV medication for the treatment of people with HIV. It does not extend to HIV medication for HIV-negative people for the purpose of PrEP.

What medications are covered by the HIV co-payment waiver?

Medications for the treatment of HIV that are listed on the <u>Pharmaceutical Benefits</u> Scheme (PBS).

I take other medications along with my HIV medication. Are these medications also covered by the HIV co-payment waiver?

No, only your HIV medication is covered by this co-payment waiver.

Can I access the HIV co-payment waiver at any pharmacy?

If you are Medicare-eligible, you can access the co-payment waiver at any pharmacy in Queensland.

If you are Medicare-ineligible, you can only have your medication dispensed at a Queensland public hospital pharmacy.

Why do I have to provide consent at a community pharmacy?

You need to consent to the community pharmacy providing some of your personal information to the Pharmacy Guild, so that the pharmacy can be reimbursed for the copayment waiver.

What personal information will the community pharmacy give to the Pharmacy Guild? The Pharmacy Guild will be provided with your name, Medicare number, postcode and the details of the medication dispensed.

What happens to my information when I give consent at a community pharmacy?

The Pharmacy Guild is bound by the Privacy Act 1988 (Commonwealth) to protect your personal information and will only use your details for the purposes of reimbursing the community pharmacy.

What happens if I don't give consent to the community pharmacy? Can I still access the HIV co-payment waiver?

No. You may decline to complete the patient consent form, in which case you will be responsible for paying the co-payment for your HIV medication.

You can access the co-payment waiver at a public hospital pharmacy without completing a consent form.

How long is my patient consent form valid for?

The patient consent form is valid for 3 years, after which time you will need to complete a new form.

Does the pharmacy keep a copy of my patient consent form?

No, the pharmacy is not required to keep a copy of your form. You are required to keep your form and present it each time you have a prescription for HIV medication filled at a community pharmacy. A clear copy of your patient consent form (for example, a photo on your phone) is also acceptable.

What happens if I lose my patient consent form?

If your patient consent form is lost, damaged or unreadable, you will be asked to complete a new consent form before the pharmacist can dispense your HIV medication. A clear copy of your patient consent form (for example, a photo on your phone) is also acceptable.

Do I have to provide consent at a public hospital pharmacy?

No. You are not required to provide written consent if you are having your medication dispensed at a Queensland public hospital pharmacy as hospital pharmacies will not be reimbursed for the co-payment.

Do I have to be Medicare-eligible to access the HIV co-payment waiver?

No. People who are a resident of Queensland beyond a short-term stay (three months) and who do not have a Medicare card can access the co-payment waiver at public hospital pharmacies, while they are living in Queensland.

Do I have to be a Queensland resident?

Yes, only Queensland residents are eligible to access this program.

Can I see a doctor outside Queensland and still get my HIV co-payment waiver at a Queensland pharmacy?

Yes. If you are a Queensland resident living in a border area and meet the eligibility criteria, you can access the program even if you see a doctor outside of Queensland.

Will co-payments paid by Queensland Health count towards the patient safety net? Yes. Co-payments paid by Queensland Health count towards the PBS patient safety net.

I'm visiting Queensland from interstate/overseas; can I access the HIV co-payment waiver?

No, only Queensland residents who have been living in Queensland for more than 3 months are eligible to access this program.

What should I do if the pharmacy tries to charge a co-payment for my HIV medication? This should not happen, as pharmacies have received information about the co-payment waiver from Queensland Health and the Pharmacy Guild. If necessary, refer the pharmacy to the Pharmacy Guild.
