2 in 5 Australian women will experience an unintended pregnancy.

1 in 3 of these will result in an abortion.

Community pharmacy pilot programs show how rapid treatment prevents escalation and reduces health system load.

Immediate care, immediate impact

93% of women received care within 24 hours during pharmacy pilots, no GP backlog, no delay. Reducing the load on frontline health services.

78%

patients were comfortable receiving birth control initiation

Did you know?

UTIs were the #1 condition causing potentially preventable hospitalisations (PPH) in Australia in 2023–24.
