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Claiming the Pharmacy Incentive Scheme

The NSW Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) aims to reduce the social, health and economic harms associated with opioid abuse. There are 3 types of opioid pharmacotherapy available in NSW: methadone, buprenorphine and buprenorphine-naloxone.

Registering for OTP

When first registering for the OTP service, a completed application form must be provided to the Ministry of Health. There are set requirements which must be met before an application is considered, including:

- All proprietors of the pharmacy must be listed
- The pharmacy name must be on the Pharmacy Council of NSW's register
- The listed pharmacy must be approved to supply pharmaceutical benefits under section 90 of the National Health Act 1953¹.

From 1 July 2018, pharmacies dosing pharmacotherapy through the NSW Opioid Treatment Program are required to lodge a 6-motnhly declaration form to the Pharmacy Guild of Australia (NSW Branch). This new form replaces the Methadone/Buprenorphine Pharmacy Incentive Scheme Monthly Return (MPIS 11/12) form, which pharmacies previously lodged with the Pharmaceutical Regulatory Unit.

The Pharmacy Incentive Scheme Declaration Forms must be submitted within one month of the end of the reporting period, meaning by 31 May and 30 November respectively. This payment is capped at 20 patients per pharmacy.

This simplification of the Pharmacy Incentive Scheme means a streamlining of processes and will lead to quicker incentives payments to pharmacies.

Changes to registered OTP pharmacy

A pharmacy must re-register to supply methadone and/or buprenorphine if the following circumstances are applicable:

- Change in ownership (new proprietors or partners)
- Change in trading name of pharmacy
- Addition of a drug (methadone or buprenorphine, as applicable).

It is highly recommended that applications for reregistration be submitted in advance but no earlier than 7 business days before the changes take effect. This is to minimise disruption to the supply of methadone and/or buprenorphine to the pharmacy¹.

Claiming incentive requirements

Pharmacies who newly register for the OTP service are eligible for an introductory one-off payment following certification that the pharmacy has dosed at least one patient continuously for a minimum of 2 months. Additionally, both new and existing pharmacies are eligible to receive an incentive payment of \$110 (GST included) per capita every 6 months for patients who have been dosed continuously for 2 months.
